


AmeriCares is the **largest provider** of donated medicines, vaccines and supplies in the United States, with more than **\$227 million** in aid in 2014 and **\$3.6 billion** delivered to date.



- Authorized to distribute in all **50 states**
- **\$85 million** in medicines, vaccines and supplies delivered to 653 U.S. safety net partners
- **\$2.3 million** in emergency aid provided for 15 U.S. disasters
- **\$1.8 million** in artificial hips and knees donated for **117 free joint replacement surgeries**
- **\$135 million** in free prescriptions to more than 135,000 patients through AmeriCares Patient Assistance Program
- **Four free clinics** for low-income uninsured in Connecticut

Filling unmet needs in the safety net

More than half of all products AmeriCares distributed to the U.S. safety net met the top three medication needs reported by free and charitable clinics.



Diabetes: donated medicines and supplies valued at \$15.3 million, including diabetes medications, blood glucose testing supplies, lancets, and insulin needles and syringes



Cardiovascular: provided hypertension and dyslipidemia medicine valued at \$18.9 million, enough to fill 272,000 monthly prescriptions



Respiratory: donated medicines worth \$9.6 million, enough to fill 79,000 monthly prescriptions to treat asthma and COPD
